

'Deadly Dinner' combines my family's traditions with research into murder mysteries and 1970s surrealist dinner parties. This context informs my womenswear collection, ensuring sensitivity to stereotypes about women's roles in the kitchen and uncanny references to a very British fascination with murder mystery story lines. My work reflects on historical gender roles while maintaining the playful spirit of the eccentric dinner parties of my childhood.

Textiles and Print have played an important role and I have explored trompe L'oile, lenticular printing methods and both hand drawing and photographic manipulation in order to create a humorous and surreal energy. This has been aided in my illustrations of those who have attended a family dinner party. Drawing the characters swiftly and with the same energy as their personality. I wanted to maintain a child—like style to support the feeling of childhood nostalgia and edited illustrations after the parties finished digitally.


