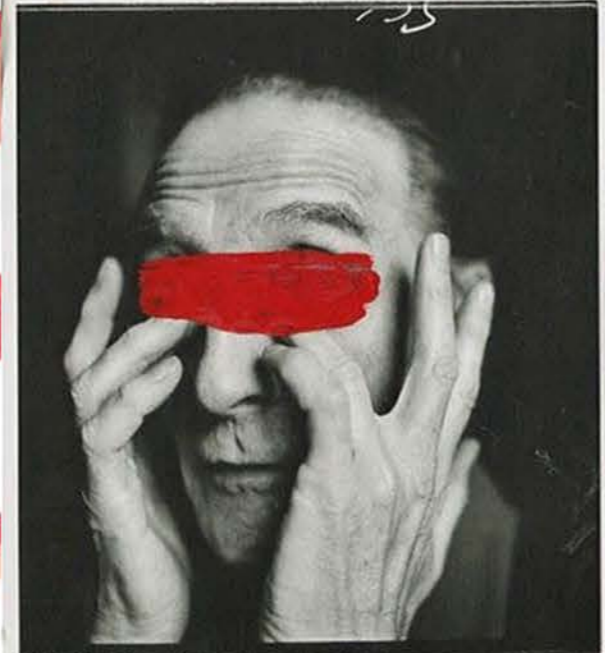
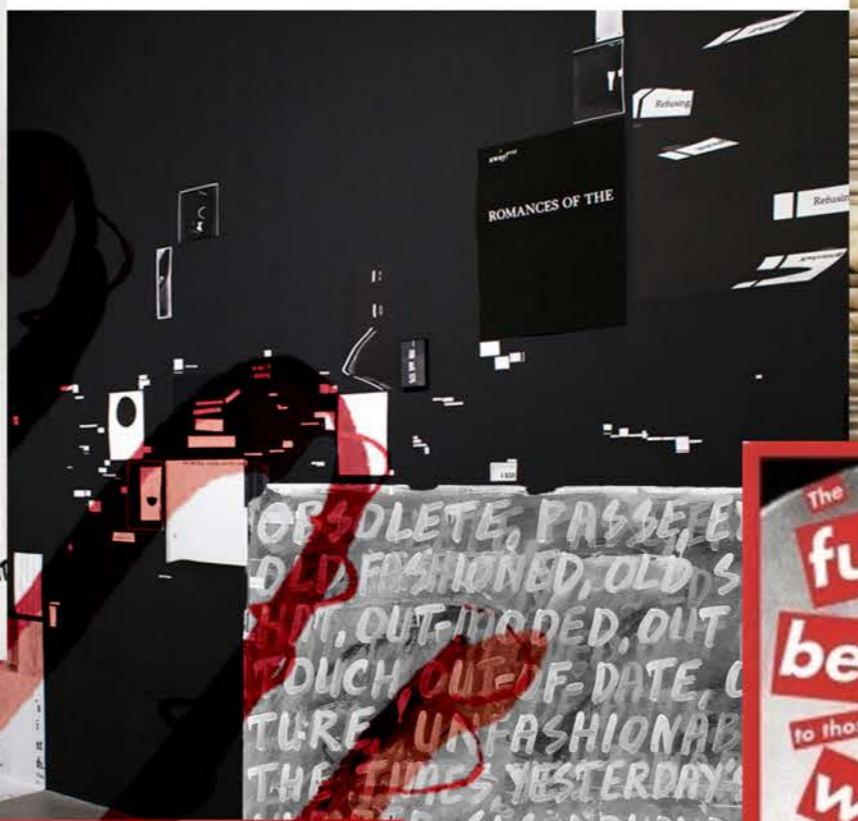
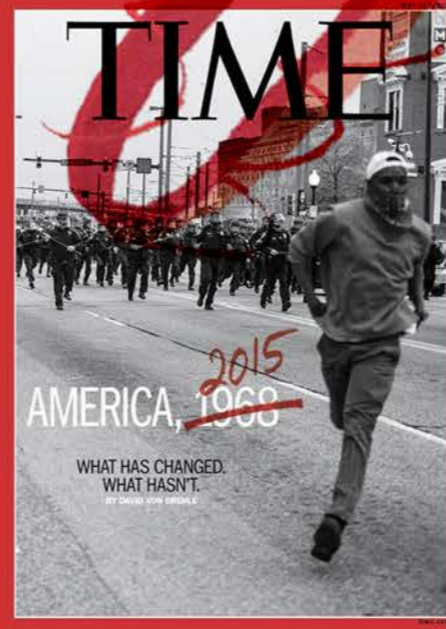

Competition is a force for good in business, so why not extend it to global regions?



It is widely agreed amongst economists that competition is a force for good in most, perhaps nearly all, market sectors. A variety of producers forever seeking an edge in reducing costs, improving quality and searching for innovation helps to ensure that consumers get an ever better deal.

Companies may dream of knocking out their competitors, but typically are simply acquiring modestly enhanced market share. Those who first find a way of securing better supply chains, cutting overheads or somehow making their offering more convenient and attractive find themselves with more customers and greater profits. The laggards, or new entrants, swiftly learn from best practice and find their own ways to catch up or even leap ahead.

Such is the miracle of competition that we find ways to legally prevent monopolies emerging and have a swathe of rules to prevent cartels. As Adam Smith pointed out in *The Wealth of Nations*, when those of the same trade meet together this could well be to engage in "a conspiracy against the public or in some contrivance to raise prices". In other words, you want companies to be battling against each other not to form a common front to extract greater returns from customers.

The same sort of principles that apply to competition in the private sector can be adapted for the governmental sector. Different local areas might be under the same broad legal structure but that is no reason to prevent them diverging in meaningful ways when it comes to tax, regulation and spending decisions. A federal structure for government is usually advocated using the same sort of arguments that are deployed in favour of competitive markets. If one municipality finds a way to effectively tackle or solve a given problem, others may follow their lead. Of course, it is not only about a

learning and copying process, sometimes different strokes are desired by different folks. What is good for the rural Rutland is not necessarily suitable for the metropolitan Manchester gander.

The US appears to benefit from this broad approach. Alabama and New York do not necessarily simply copy each other's precise policy approaches but there is a healthy competition between the 50 states.

Despite the creation of the Scottish parliament and Welsh assembly and the emergence of metropolitan mayors, the UK is the most centralised country in the democratic world. Most important policy decisions are made in Whitehall and the ability to diverge from regulations, tax rates or spending priorities at a local level is minimal.

Supporters of competition and innovation in the governmental sphere have therefore tended to advocate a much greater degree of devolution in Britain. I have gone so far as to argue that you could actually have different immigration rules for different areas. If

This is, of course, a rather more complex task than pushing for, say, Andy Burnham to have a handful of additional planning responsibilities as mayor in Manchester. The aim is to find some nation that might be willing to grant such status to a new authority perhaps in return for a sort of profit share. The concept is that a population would then flow into the area attracted by a radically different approach to personal freedom, taxation and service provision. Core governmental services would probably be provided for a flat fee, not out of levying general taxes at all. Some form of independent arbitration mechanism would need to be found between the authority running the zone and the citizens choosing to reside there but the founder of the Free Cities Foundation, Titus Gebel, does not see this as an insurmountable barrier.

Geopolitical tensions are a worry but threats to growth lie elsewhere

According to the IMF it is too early to say how events in Israel will affect the global economy but businesses are already concerned.

Early evidence from the latest Oxford Economics Global Risk Survey suggests that business sentiment has been shaken by the crisis. Businesses now perceive a weaker growth outlook than in last month's survey. The risk of very weak activity is also thought to have increased. Geopolitical tensions are identified as the single greatest threat to the global economy.

Concerns extend well beyond Israel, however. About a third of businesses judge that developments in the Middle East represent a very significant risk to the global economy in the near-term but unease over China-Taiwan relations is even more widespread. A key fear is that an escalation of tensions in the Taiwan Strait might trigger a trade war and economic decoupling. Such worries are understandable

up production costs and the prices of final consumer goods. With policymakers still intent on returning inflation to target, any hopes of early policy rate cuts next year would be dashed.

It is not difficult to imagine a sizeable effect on economies around the world even in the absence of outright conflict. Under plausible assumptions, global growth would slow sharply, to only about 1 per cent in 2024. The impact would be even greater in the event of severe disruption to the supply of Taiwanese semiconductors.

The British economy is no exception. The combination of heightened geopolitical uncertainty and trade war would be a large enough shock to push Britain into recession.

GATHERED JUMPER DEVELOPMENT



Look 1- Jumper

Garment Descriptions:

Oversized asymmetric jumper with double collar neckline. Full left sleeve finished in open-ended 1 by 1 trim. Cut out arm whole on left side finished in the same trim with mitred v shape. Wide round neck with outer collar matching cuffs and inner roll neck in 1 by 1 trim. Double layer construction with inner fitted 5g half milano base and oversized 1/2 2.5 half cardigan and 1 by 1 striped outer layer. Joined with over locking at the sleeve head and caught in trim linking in other seams. The outer fabric has been gathered by hand and stitched in place with a latch needle.

Machines:

Linker 3 point (6 point using every other needle)

Over locker

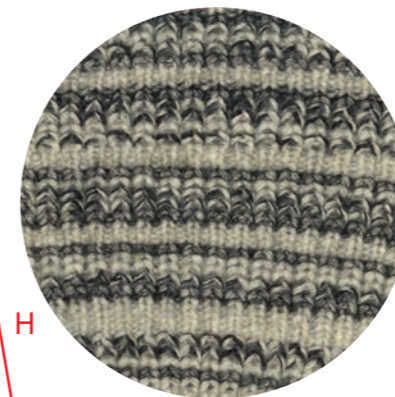
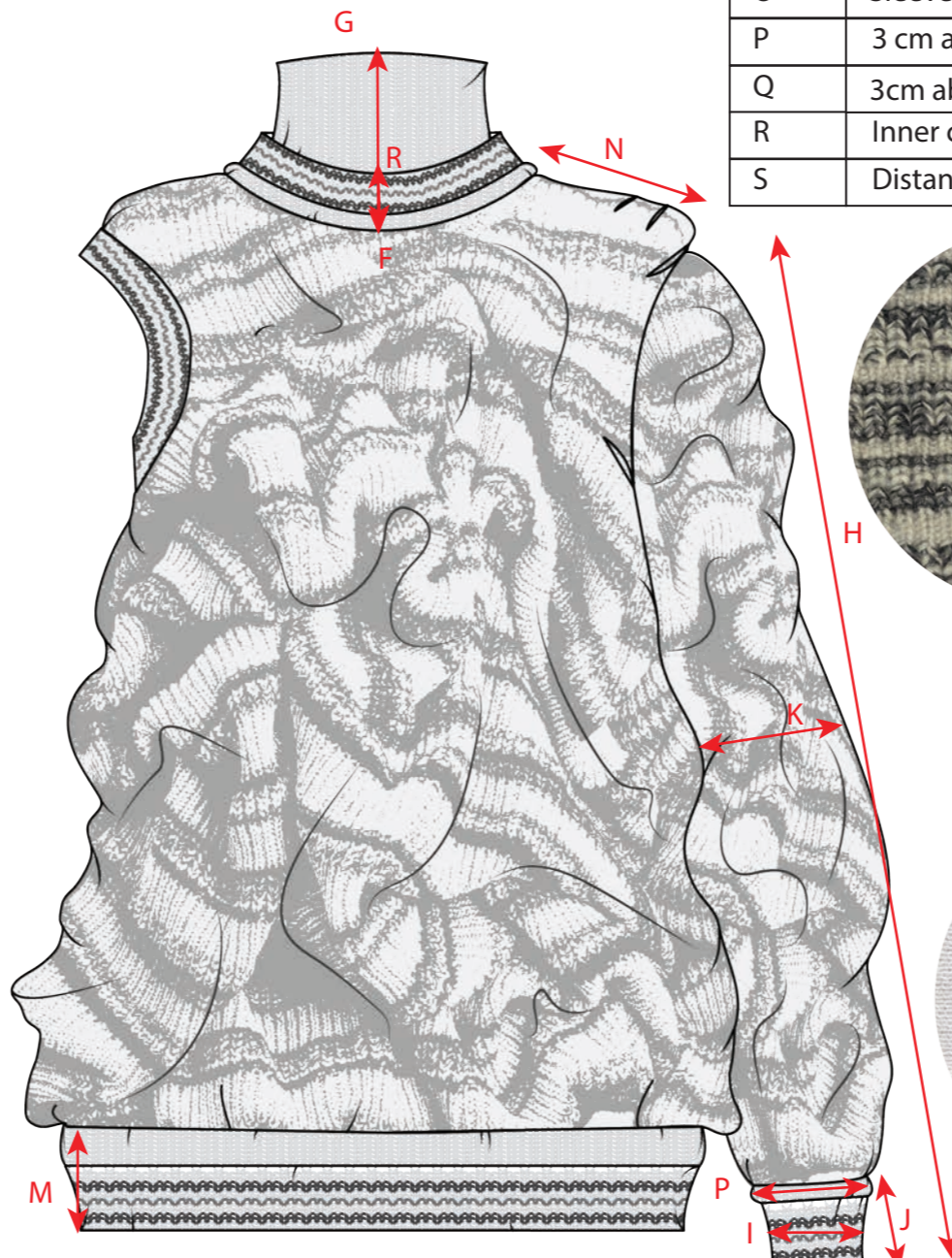
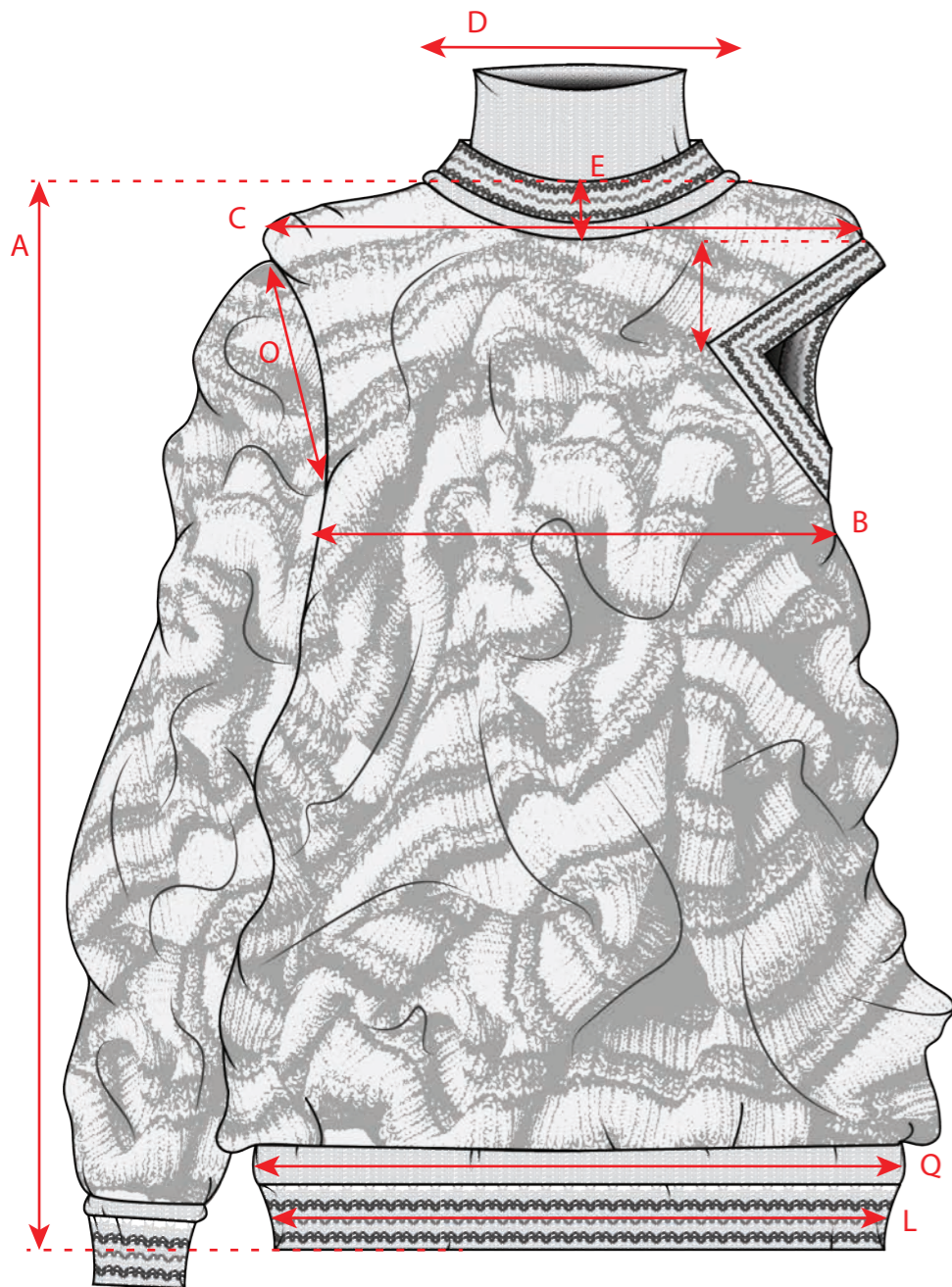

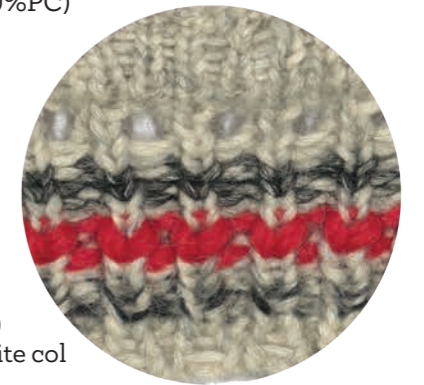
Positives-The garment uses natura fibres from dead stock yarn preventing the production of new fibres and not adding to the demand for synthetic fibres. The fabric was particularly fashioned with only the neck and sleeve shaping on the inner layer being cut and sew. This has saved the wasting of excess material. The garment has no hard fastenings and would fully biodegrade in time.

Negatives- The jumper is extremely oversized and uses a huge amount of yarn to produce.

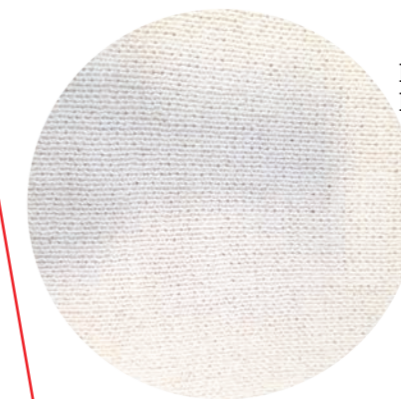
